RESOLUTION OF A SIGNIFICANT SAFETY CONCERN (SSC) — HAITI

1. The Council, at the twelfth meeting of its 179th Session, approved the mechanism for addressing Significant Safety Concerns (SSCs) identified during the conduct of safety oversight activities under the Universal Safety Oversight Audit Programme (USOAP).

2. In December 2012, ICAO identified an SSC in Haiti pertaining to its air operator certification process. In accordance with the mechanism approved by the Council, the ICAO SSC Validation Committee determined that the corrective actions taken by Haiti had resolved the immediate risk associated with the SSC finding. As a result, the SSC is no longer posted on the ICAO public website (<u>https://www.icao.int/safety/pages/usoap-results.aspx</u>) as well as the ICAO USOAP Continuous Monitoring Approach (CMA) online framework (<u>https://www.icao.int/usoap</u>).

3. Presently, three SSCs identified by ICAO remain unresolved. The ICAO Member States with unresolved SSCs that remain posted on the secure website are the following: Bhutan, Eritrea and the five Member States of the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) which are also Member States of ICAO (namely, Antigua and Barbuda, Grenada, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines).
